

By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 30th day of October 1730 for Surveying to James Steel of the City of Philadelphia the Lot and Liberty land belonging to five hundred acres the Original purchase of William Boswell. Surveyd and Layd out the 17th day of 7br 1731 a piece of Land in Northern Liberties of the City Philadelphia beginning a Post in a corner of Richd. Vick's land in a Line of the German Township. Thence by the said line South East by South thirty perches to a black Oak Then west south west twenty Eight perches to a spanish Oak Then South south East thirty <sup>five</sup> perches to a black Oak Then west South west twenty four perches to a post Then by vacant Land and John Ashmead north north west thirty five perches to a post Then by a line of the said Vick's Land East north East twenty three perches to a Maple Then up a small run of Run of water about thirty eight perches to the place of beginning Contain<sup>ing</sup> eight acres.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eighteenth day of October 1910
