

I do hereby officially certify that the above is a draft of a tract of land situate in \_\_\_\_\_ Township, Mercer County and State of Pennsylvania, which is numbered in the general draft of the fourth district of donation land, eight hundred and fifty seven, said to be an undrawn tract. Bounded as above, surveyed the 18th day of September A.D. 1822, according to the original corners and lines on the ground. In pursuance of the actual settlement of Joseph Nelson continued by John McDowell, who is now and was when the survey was made, residing on the same with his family, engaged in improving and cultivating it, and on it there is a large improvement made. There is in the tract one hundred and ninety two acres and 24 perches with the usual allowance of six per cent for roads &c.

Given under my hand the 22<sup>d</sup> day of November A.D. one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven.
