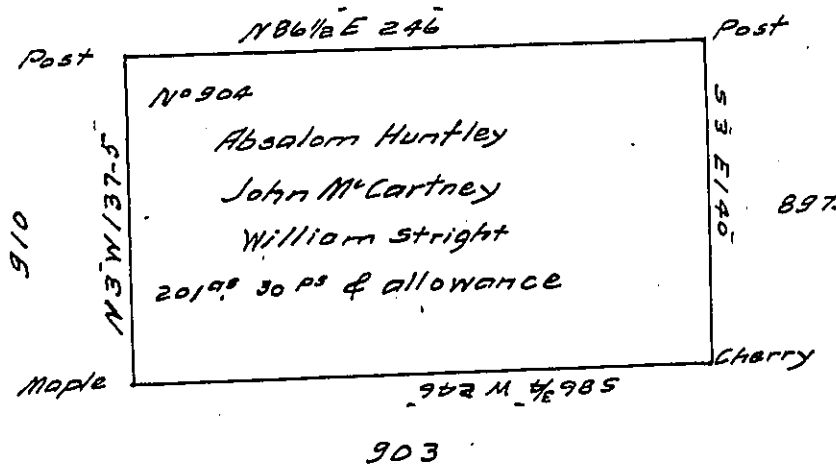


Donation Land

This is a draft of a tract of land in the fifth donation district in Sandy Creek Township Mercer County; numbered on the general draft of said district nine hundred and four, said to be an undrawn tract, and as such surveyed according to the original corners lines and marks on the ground. In pursuance of the actual settlement of Absalom Huntley & John Mc Cartney, William Stright also claiming a part of the Land. This settlement and improvement was commenced soon after the law of 1813 was passed, for the sale of undrawn donation land - Surveyed the sixth day of May 1826. Containing two hundred and one acres and thirty perches and allowance, at the time of surveying Huntley & Mc Cartney with their families were residing on the tract and engaged in improving the same. Their improvements were much more than the law requires to enable them to obtain their title &c.

I hereby Officially Certify that it does not appear from the Books and other documents in my office that the above land has been granted to any person other than the present applicants or those under whom they claim. - Provided the tract is an undrawn one. Given under my hand this 21st day of Nov. 1826
