



In pursuance of an actual settlement being made, and continued according to law, by John Grier, was resurveyed on the thirteenth day of December 1822. the above described Tract of Land, containing Two hundred and Seventy Acres and one hundred and eight perches, and allowance of six percent for Roads &c., it being Lot No 126 in the sixth district of donation lands, situate in Wayne township in Crawford county, and at the time of making said Survey, Peter Hashenbate the apparent owner, was residing on the same, and had a house thereon fit for the habitation of man; and there appeared to be upwards of fifteen Acres cleared fenced and cultivated on the same.
