



By Virtue of warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 26th day of Nov: Anno Dom. 1736 Surveyed on the 27th day of February Anno Dom. 1737 unto James Armstrong a tract of land (obliterated) township of Paxton in the county of Lancaster. Beginning at a whight oak in the line of Thomas Penn Esqr. (obliterated) Land thence north by east 155 p. to an oak, thence west by north 221 p. to a post, thence south by west 158 p. (variation of y<sup>e</sup> Compass 3 p.) to a post thence east by south 221 p. to y<sup>e</sup> place of beginning. Containing 204 acres and the allowance of six acres of land for roads & high ways
