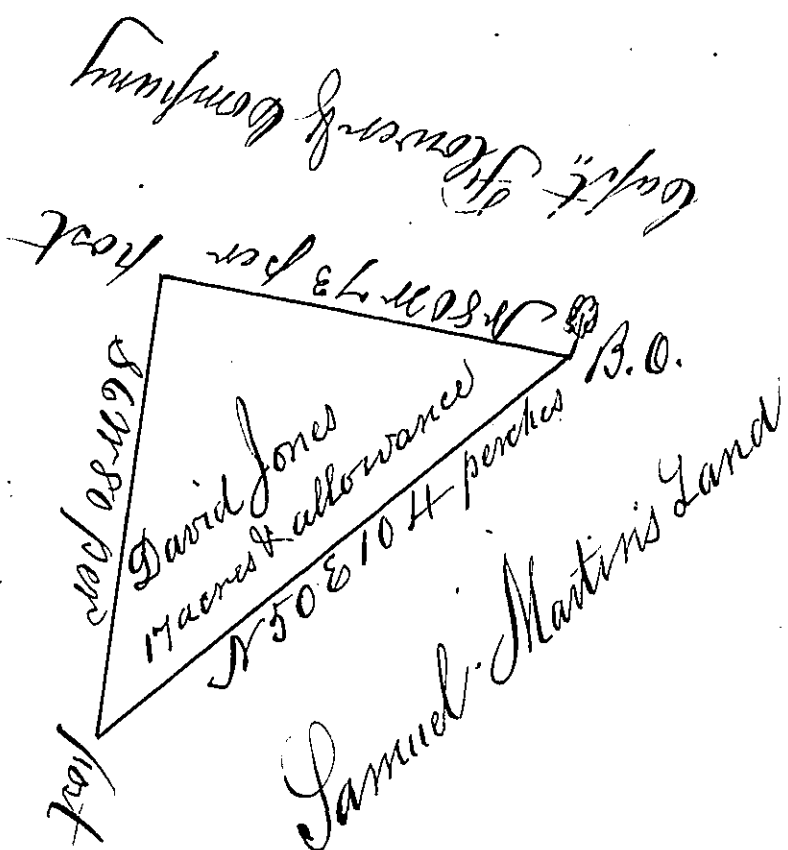


David Jones's other land



Whereas a warrant from the Proprietaries to Survey 581 acres in any part of this Province bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup> day of August 1758 was granted to John Read of the city of Philadelphia, Blacksmith, (who by his deed bearing date the 16<sup>th</sup> day of September 1758 granted & conveyed unto Joseph Rawlings 152. acres in part of the said 581 acres, who by his deed bearing date the 5<sup>th</sup> day of December 1760 granted & conveyed the same 152 acres unto Joseph Richardson, who by his deed bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> day of January 1764 granted & conveyed unto the above named David Jones of Carnarvan in the County of Berks, Inholder the full quantity of 17 acres of unlocated land in part of the said 152 acres aforesaid as by the said warrant & several recited Conveyances recourse being thereunto respectively had may fully appear) In pursuance of which recited warrant Surveyed on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the 1<sup>st</sup> month 1764 unto the above named David Jones 17 acres of land situate in Carnarvan Township in the County of Berks aforesaid bounded and limited as above described
