Situate on Conewango Creek in Little Township Lancaster County was Survey'd in Pursuance of four Warrants whose Dates are as follows Viz: The Large Piece Described by C containing ~~26 3/4~~ 26 7/8 Acre or all allowance was Survey'd in Pursuance of a warrant first Granted to William Fulton Dated July 21st 1734 & Resurvey'd to James Gillespie by Warrant Dated 1st May 1742

2nd by Tho. 56 1/2 Acre Survey'd by Warrant Dated 2nd of March 1743

3rd by Tho. 42 1/4 Acre Survey'd by 2nd of Apr 1743 By Warrant Dated July 20th 1748
14th & lastly The 53 1/4 Acre Described above by Doras Survey'd In Pursuance of a Warrant Dated ^{in the year 1749. say 20th March 1740} I was going to write the Date But Looking in the Warrant I found it not put in, but left blank I suppose thro' a mistake

Containing in all 54 6 1/2 Acre & the allowance of 6 1/2 Cent for Roads & Highways

The 12 6 1/4 & the 56 1/2 both Returned into the Secretary's Office the 20th May 1774.
