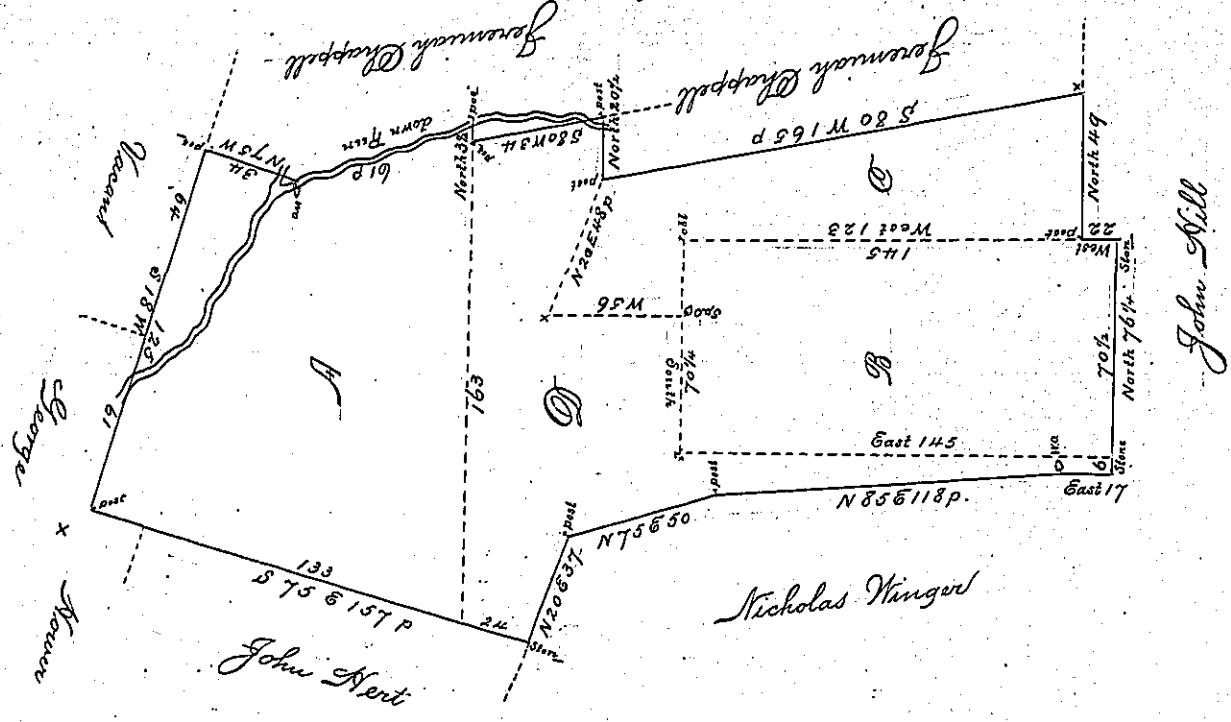

By Virtue of four Warrant there was four Sundry Surveys Made, the one Marked with the Letter A is part of Survey made to Henry Seeger by a Warrant Dated the 25 Day of March 1738 by Receipt Dated the 11 Day of April 1753 for two Hundred Acres And paid Ten pounds And the said Henry Seeger sold unto Eberhard Shoppell As it will Appear by Conveyance Dated 21 day of May 1763 Contain Eighty Eight Acres 113 perches And the Allowance, the Survey Marked with the Letter B Surveyd unto George Kover Warrant Dated fourth day of April 1750 as it Will Appear by Sundry Conveyances Sold unto Eberhard Shoppell Containing Sixty Acres And Allowances And the Survey Marked C Surveyd unto Eberhard Shoppell in Right of Jeremiah Choppell Warrant Dated the 15 day of April 1772 Containing forty one Acres 52 perches and the Allowance, the Survey Marked with the Letter D Surveyd unto Eberhard Shoppell by a Warrant Dated 28 day of January 1785 Containing fifty seven Acres And the Allowance of Six p. Cent All the above described Tracts of Land Situate in Windsor Township Berks County the whole Containing two Hundred and forty seven Acres And ~~6~~ and the Allowance this 19 day of January 1786 the Bearer agrees to pay the office fees
