



Situate in Fawn Township in the County of York. That part where the letter A is placed in the above Diagram, represented by red lines containing as above set forth 54^{ac} & 126 perches & allowance being part of a larger Tract of 138^{1/2}^{ac} and allowance &c. which was originally surveyed by John Churchman on the 30th of the 8th month 1744. In Pursuance of a Warrant granted to William Graydon bearing date the 2^d of November A.D. 1741. The part B represented by Yellow lines containing as above set forth 104^{ac} & 100 perches. Being part of a larger Tract of 344^{ac} & 50 perches and allowance &c. which was originally surveyed by Thomas Armor, and afterwards Resurveyed on the 22^d day of the 10th month 1765 by William Matthews late D.S. for Henry Corrill. In Pursuance of a Warrant for 150^{ac} granted to Mathew Payne dated the 20th day of March 1758. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger Tracts of Land on the 9th day of April A.D. 1799. And now at the request of James Wiley in behalf of himself, and for the use of Elizabeth Wiley his Daughter and yet a Minor the above has been Calculated examined and Corrected the 25th day of November A.D. 1809. who desired the same to be returned for Confirmation.
