



The above Tract of 709^a 131^p & allorance was Surveyed to William Narlan In Pursuance of two Warrants, one in his own Name for 300^a Dated the 12th of the month called August 1735. the other in the name of Joseph Parker for 50^a bearing Date the 21st day of the month called March 1750. The above Tract of 70: 2^a 12^p & allorance is part of a Tract of Land comprized in a Patent granted to the said William Narlan Dated the ninth of the Month called ~~September~~ ^{July} 1744. The residuum of the said Tract was Patented to John Taylor before that Time, and Contains 108^a 1^p 28^p & allorance Situate on Doe Run a branch of Brandywine in Chester County.

Note the Difference in the Present Courses from the former is only occasioned by the Variation and Difference of Compasses.
