



The two Parcels of Land above described are situate in East Nottingham Township Chester County, on Jordan & Pigeon Creek at & near their Junction which makes Little Elk River. The 93<sup>ac</sup> Tract was originally Survey'd in the year 1753 By Warrant to Darby McFiggins (as above mentioned) a copy of which was directed to me, & resurvey'd for Abraham Sidwell the 12<sup>th</sup> of the 10 mo 1784 after he Purchas'd The Tract of 21<sup>ac</sup> & 3.5<sup>perches</sup> contiguous to the other, was Survey'd the 8<sup>th</sup> of the 8<sup>th</sup> mo 1786 In pursuance of a warrant granted to said Abraham Sidwell, Dated the 2<sup>d</sup> of February 1786 (he having purchased some Land which Elisha Gatchel had on a Part thereof, & having also given to said Gatchel the privilege of the water & a Mill Race) by a proper Instrument of writing; was desirous of having both Tracts exhibited together in one Return: Beginning at a Stone on the <sup>West</sup> Bank of Pigeon Creek in a Line of Patrick Powers Land & running thence by the same N 80° W 74<sup>perch</sup> to a Chestnut Tree, thence by Richard Sidwell's Land S 20<sup>1/2</sup> W 36<sup>perch</sup> 8 tenths to a N. W. & S 87° W 56<sup>1/2</sup> perch to a white Oak, thence by Land granted to John Andrew, S 20<sup>1/2</sup> W 79<sup>1/2</sup> perch to a heap of Stones, thence by the same & Patrick Hamilton's Land S 70° E 1.50 perch to a stone, thence also by said Hamilton's Land S 7° W 10 perches to a stone, thence by Land of Elisha Gatchel N 87<sup>1/2</sup> E 81<sup>1/2</sup> perch to a stone, thence by Land of David Wharry North 48° West 97<sup>1/2</sup> perch to a Stone on the West side of Pigeon Creek aforesaid, thence up the several Courses of that Stream, or along the middle of the Creek Northward, till it comes opposite to the Place of Beginning, being about 100 perches. Containing 11.7 acres & 3.5 perches & the allowance of 6<sup>per cent</sup>. Including both Tracts - - - Certified this 31<sup>st</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> mo. 1785, on Behalf of John Churchman Dept Surveyor to whom the last Warrant above mentioned was Directed
