



In pursuance of an order of the Board of Property dated the 28th day of July 1766 I have surveyed the several Claims and Improvements of James Smith Robert Gillcrest and Thomas Cowan and find James Smith's place was settled in the year 1744. Robert Gillcrest's place held by claim ever since that time but not settled until the year 1757. Thomas Cowan's place settled in the year and I find the several tracts to contain the Quantities set down in each Draught but previous to my Surveying of them James Smith purchased of Israel Morris three hundred acres of an old right in part of the 3350^a for which warrant was Granted to John Reed the 16th of August 1766. Surveyed the 2^d, 3^d and 4^d of the month of June 1766 and previous thereto I had Surveyed McCaskay's Hall the place where Ebenezer Smith settled in the year 1744 for Neil McCaskay assignee of said Smith on warrant dated the 18th of December 1751 granted to Jno. Allen & Jeremiah Brown the right of which is now vested in said McCaskay and I also had Surveyed Allen's Folly for Thomas Allen on a warrant for 100^a dated the 1st day of October 1765 and as the said five several tracts of Land lay Adjoining each other I thought proper to Lay Down the several Draughts in order to shew the Vacancy which I find to contain 23° 28' and allorance of 6 p.c. Surveyed and Laid Down as afores^d. All of which is submitted to the Board of Property
