



Donegall 12th January 1775

Sir, I enclose herewith you have a General Draught of lands in Mountjoy Township Lancaster County Granted to two men of the name of Allison.

Richard Allison on the 12th of October 1739 obtained a Warrant, & in Pursuance of the same Samuel Blunston the then dep^y Surveyor Survey'd & Marked for him as laid down by the black lines which comprehend the Waters containing 456¹/₂^a allor^e or thereabouts. — On William Miller's (who is one of the present Possessors) marrying one of his daughters he divided off to him about 127³/₄^a & allor^e & the remaining 328³/₄^a he gave to his Son William Allis ob^t who obtained a Warrant on the 20th Jan^y 1745 for the adjoining Piece of 67¹/₄^a & allor^e also laid down in black lines. therefore the said William Allison died possessed of 396^a or thereabouts & left a Widdow & Eight Children who upon Settlement with the Orphan's Court for the County of Lancaster ordered the present Robert Allison son & heir of the afores^d William Allison to take Possession of the Premises paying off the other legates, & to enable him to do the same he sold to John Kish 58³/₄^a & allor^e as laid down by a dotted line & to the Eastward of the Ptca. of Chiquisabungo, as also sold to his Bro^r William Allison 60³/₄^a on the west side of the Plantation — there remains yet in his Possession 276¹/₂^a & allor^e the above is a true state of the Case as I have found on the premises
