



Situate in Lower Chanceford Township in the County of York. That part included within the red lines, where the letter A, is placed in the above diagram containing 19^{ac} 41^{perches} and allowance &c. Surveyed at the Request of the Owner Richard Porter in Pursuance of a Warrant for 20^{ac} Granted to John Lusk dated the 21st day of February A.D. 1786. And That part within the Yellow lines where the letter B, is placed in the above draught, containing 28^{ac} 44^{perches} and allowance &c. Surveyed in Pursuance of a warrant for 50^{ac} Granted to James Duncan bearing date the 28th day of June A.D. 1814. I further beg leave to state that the said James Duncan claims the whole of the above described Land as well that part within the Red lines, as that within the Yellow lines, containing together 47^{ac} 8^{perches} & 5^{perches} and allowance &c. in Pursuance of his warrant for 50^{ac} above mentioned, the whole surveyed as the same is above represented on the 25th day of April A.D. 1815. N.B. the improvements consisting of part of a Claim filed on the part within the Yellow lines.
