



Situate in Town Township in the County of York. That part marked with the letters of the alphabet represents the land as surveyed on the 5<sup>th</sup> of the 5<sup>th</sup> month 1770 by William Matthews late D.D. for Lotise Bailey in pursuance of the application to the 10<sup>th</sup> of 1769 in the name of Thomas Bohannon and returned into the Surveyor General's Office which appears to be erroneous as it intersects with a tract of land now the property of Alexander Galbraith as surveyed for Daniel Crow in right of Richard Demet on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of October A.D. 1755. That part included within the red lines, appears to have been the land intended by the said Thomas Bohannon's application as surveyed on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1785, by Joshua Demet D.D. under William Kersey late Deputy Surveyor for James Davison in pursuance of the above described application and contains by calculation eighty acres and 146 perches & allowances as appears for a draught thereof particularly made, the lines of which seem to answer the draught as some of them have been run by us on the second day of September instant. That the draught as marked with the red lines in the above diagram appears also to show his other land represented by the dotted lines of 50<sup>±</sup> and 23<sup>±</sup> 7/8<sup>±</sup> as surveyed by the said Demet in pursuance of a warrant granted to James Sulkan dated the 6<sup>th</sup> of February A.D. 1787. And that we know of no adverse claim for any part of the said land as included within the red lines above set forth.
