



December 23rd 1851-

I began to execute a Warrant for John Dehey of Pittsburg dated the 1st day of December 1851. Which is embraced in the Red lines, on the opposite page. I commenced at Balzar & Bartons Land on the line S 61° E and traced a well marked line which John Dehey said he had run in 1825 - until I came to the line S 61° W. 36 perches which came to Robert Cochrans field Cochran prevented me from closing the Survey. He had a claim to the greater portion of the Land we had taken in for Deheys Survey. That he had a settlement right commencing in the month of February 1814 has held possession, improved, raised grain, and paid taxes for the same.

After receiving official instructions I went on the 23rd day of December 1852 and executed the aforesaid Warrant containing one hundred and ninety five acres and twenty four perches and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c Situate in Dehey Township Westmoreland County Pa.

And now to wit On the 26th day of August 1852, surveyed the Land described in the Black lines in pursuance of a warrant granted to Robert Cochran (including his improvement) bearing date the 14th day of June 1852. Situate in Dehey Township Westmoreland County in the Gap of Chestnut Road containing three hundred and seventy two acres and eighty four perches and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c
