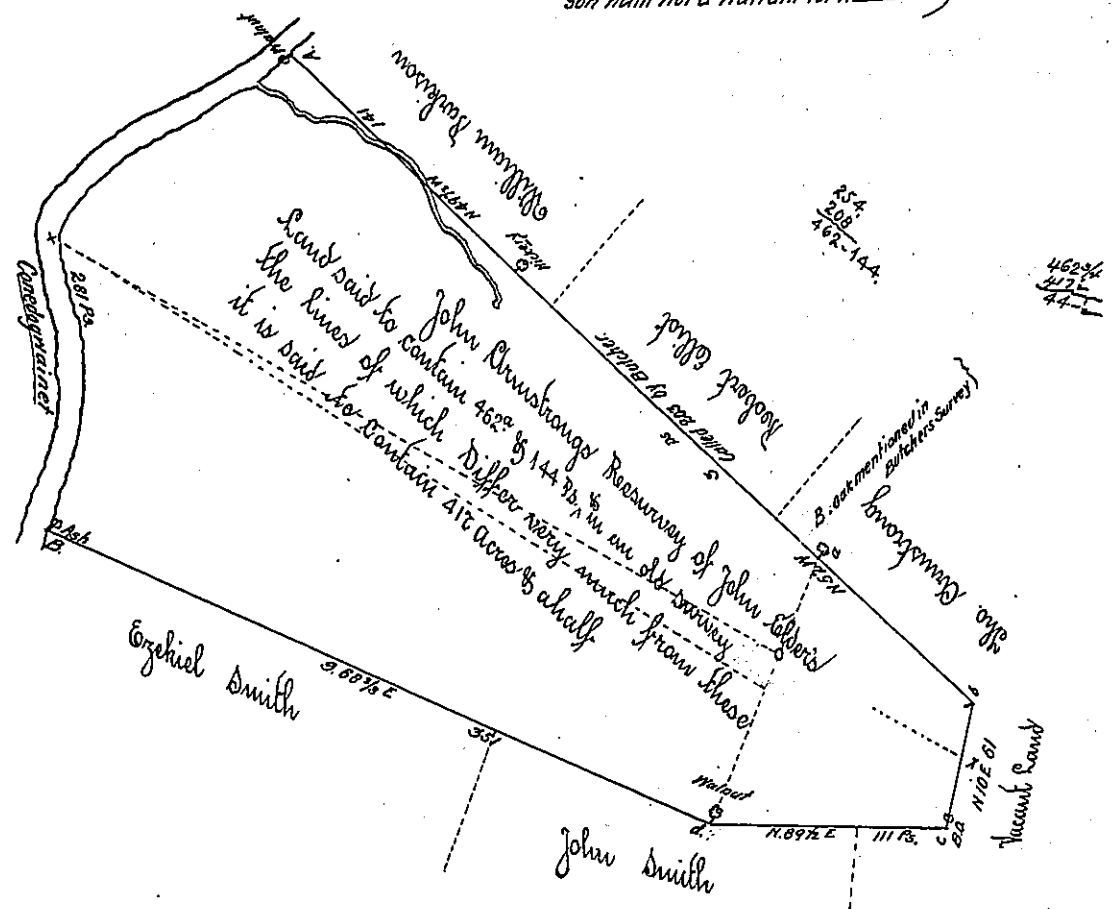

Underneath by the Letters A.B.d.a. is repented 47 1/2 acres of land Surveyed by Z. Butcher for John E... on the 3rd of May 1739 by Warrant of ye 11th of October 1738 - which Rich^d Peters Esq. Late Secretary Ordered N. Scull ~~then~~ Late S. Galt to accept into his Office on 5th Elder paying 20 £ into ye Receiver (obliterated) Office - The small piece a.b.c.d. is a piece Taken ~~in by J. Armstrong. Tho' he should no mention of his Taking in any vacant Land, Neither is it Certain that it is vacant Land for I have not Searched neither Armstrong or some other person hath not a Warrant for it~~
