



A. Situate partly in Cedarus and partly in Shrewsbury Townships, in the County of York, containing as above set forth forty one acres forty one perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Being part of a larger tract of 61<sup>ac</sup> 94<sup>pc</sup> 1/2 allowance Originally surveyed by William Matthews late D. N. on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> mo 1773, in pursuance of two Warrants granted to Thomas Connor, one for 25<sup>ac</sup> dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of February 1772, the other for 30<sup>ac</sup> dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of June 1773 said part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of March 1822. B. being also part of the same tract, resurveyed and divided off from said tract by William Jersey late D. N. on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1784 - Containing as above set forth six acres, fifty eight perches 1/2 allowance as aforesaid and now at the request of Martin Karkel the present owner, said part is examined, corrected calculated, and together with the other part returned for confirmation - March 19<sup>th</sup> 1822
