



The triangle of 143 perches marked 'A' claimed by Tho<sup>s</sup> Whinnery - was deducted at the request of the present owner Hen<sup>ry</sup> Aughenbaugh May 3<sup>d</sup> 1814.

Situate in Township Downship in the County of York, containing as above set forth 80<sup>ac</sup> 4 23 perches & allowance &c being part of a larger tract of 255<sup>ac</sup> 4 118 perches &c of land which was surveyed on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of September A.D. 1812. In pursuance of the Application No. 5585 for 300<sup>ac</sup> granted to Robert Whinnery dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 1769. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract of land on the day above mentioned for & at the request of the owner Henry Aughenbaugh who desired the same to be returned. To. D. I further beg leave to state that Thomas Whinnery claims the small triangle, above, where the letter A. is placed within the green lines contains 143 perches of land by virtue of the aforesaid Application in right of William Whinnery devisee of the said Robert Whinnery -
