



Warrant to Sarah Davis for 181 Acs. Dated 15th Octo. 1785.

In pursuance an Order of the Honorable the Board of Property ~~directing~~ bearing Date the 6th Day of June 1785, directing that Matthew Henderson Deputy Surveyor should make such alterations and regulations in the Survey by him made at the Instance of David Hersh (the Drafts whereof then laying before the Board) so as to leave a reasonable Quantity for Sarah Davis's Improvement as he the said Surveyor and Messrs William Rippey Daniel Duncan and Coll Dunlop or any two of them should judge most convenient for the said Parties in order that it may be granted to said Sarah on the Condition therein expressed. The Subscribers, three of the Messrs as aforesaid appointed (Coll Dunlop being absent) did on the 12th Day of September 1785 meet, and after having viewed the Drenises and heard the Parties and examined their respective Rights & Claims, are unanimously of Opinion that the quantity of One hundred and eighty one Acres & Allowance as the same is now laid off by the Surveyor and represented in the above Drafts, may reasonably be allowed for Sarah Davis's Improvement, and judge the above Regulation ^{to be} as nearly convenient for both Parties as may be, and further observe that there is a quantity of Vacant Land lying Eastward of each, which may augment their respective Surveys if not taken in
