



Resurveyed the above described tract of land on the 9th of April AD 1830 for the present owners, viz: Alexander Clark Esq and Matthew Rankin, containing five hundred and twelve acres thirty three perches and the allowance of six P^r Ct^s & 1/2^d which is now divided into two parts by the divisional line bearing N. 61¹/₂ W. 285¹/₂ perches from a White oak corner of the surveys of Jane Elliott and William Cowden to a White oak at the opposite boundary -- by which division, the part of Matthew Rankin contains two hundred and seventy one acres, one hundred and twenty one perches, and that of Alexander Clark contains two hundred and forty acres, sixty six perches, and the allowance of six P^r Ct^s & 1/2^d to each division -- being the same tract of land which was originally surveyed to Christopher W. Michael and James Clark in pursuance of two Warrants, the one dated Nov^r 23^d 1786, and the other Aug^t 24th AD 1786 -- which tract of land is situate in Plum Creek Township, Armstrong County bounded by lands surveyed surveyed to Jane Elliott, William Cowden, Benjamin Leasure Joseph Dunlap and others
