



Situate on the North Side of the South Branch of Frankstown Creek about two Miles above Frankstown in Huntingdon County; containing two Hundred and Seventy two Acres, thirty eight Perches and the usual Allowance for Roads &c. Resurveyed the 9th. of June 1796 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to James Harris Dated the 7th. of July 1762.

Note. The above Tract is claimed by Mr. Thomas Stewardson of the City of Philadelphia in Virtue of the same Warrant on which this is returned. Thomas McCune who lives on the Land claims it also under said Warrant.

Note also, that I have an original Survey 218acs. signed by Richard Tea- made on this Warrant on the 18th. day of May 1768 which I could not return without a Resurvey there being no Courses & Distances given on the South Branch of Frankstown Creek on which the Survey is bounded - Thomas McCune who claims this and the adjoining Tract in the Name of Wm. Fleming took in some land on the South side of the Branch, adding thereby Fifty four Acres and Thirty eight Perches to the Survey as first made.
