



The above is a Draught of a Resurvey made the 21-day of July 1813 in pursuance of a Warrant Granted William Hudson Dated the 15-day of January 1785 and also on an order of Resurvey from the Board of Property Dated the 7-day of January 1812 Containing 226 acres and 60 perches of land and allowance of Six per Cent & Situate in Greene township on Big Whiteley Creek Called Hudson Situation and was Resurveyed agreeable to the verdict of the Court and Jury.
