

of them called Ryces Island, containing eight acres & a half & allowance; another called Sassafras Island, containing six acres & three quarters with allowance & the other called Poplar Island lying opposite the Mouth of Suatawira Creek containing eight acres & a half & allowance. and I do further certify that there was surveyed by George Stevenson Esq<sup>r</sup>. the following Islands in the said River & for the use of the Honorable Proprietaries aforesaid, vizt one Island opposite to John Harris's land, containing forty four acres & allowance. another lying a little below the last described Island containing eleven acres & allowance; another Island lying below the Mouth of Yellow Breeches Creek opposite to Teaf's & Calverts, containing ten acres & allowance - the other Island, lying opposite to the land of John Day, called Hill Island, containing two hundred and sixty eight acres & allowance of Six P. Cent
