These are to authorize and require you to Survey & lay out for our use all lands in the River Susquehanna within the last Purchase made from the Indians by <sup>to</sup> ~~make~~ Returns of the same into our Secretarys Office And for your so doing this ~~to~~ be a sufficient Warrant Witness John Penn Esq. Lieutenant Governor of the said Province who by virtue of certain powers from the said Proprietaries hath hereunto set his hand and caused the Seal of the Land Office to be affixed at Philadelphia this ~~the~~ ninth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty eight
