Palmers Original Purchase of 5000 as, it stands thus, y^h altho' Mr. Scull, previous to Tho's Preston's Warrt of ye 27th March, 1755, for 1504 As. under that right, certify'd y^h so much appear'd to him to be due yet since ye overhaul of your office & C^t ~~it~~ ^{& Billy Scull's re.examⁿ of this Office if now} appears y^h he was mistaken and y^h there was no more than 809 as. due when Preston's Warrt was g^{te}d & therefore if you are satisfy'd y^h ye 809 as was then still remⁿg due on sd. Palmers Right when Preston's Warrt was g^{te}d we certainly must go on to receive & confirm ye regular Surveys under that right till y^h ball^o is compleated, & consequently if no more than y^e above 261 as has been yet return'd into my Office must ~~go on~~ ^{still} be returning into my Office till ye 809 is compleated
