



A Draught of a Tract of Land called "St Davids" situate on the Easterly Side of the North East Branch of Susquehanna River, Beginning about two miles below the Mouth of Owego & extending in front along the North East branch one thousand and twelve perches to a white pine mark'd on the River bank thence running South East five hundred and sixty perches, thence north thirty four degrees and forty <sup>five</sup> minutes east nine hundred and three perches to a corner, thence north west four hundred perches to two pine trees and a small red or tree standing on the bank of the River afores'd Containing within the boundaries thereof the quantity of three thousand and ninety two acres besides the usual allowance of 6 P. Cent for Roads & C<sup>e</sup>. Surveyed 22d day of Sept<sup>r</sup> 1773, For the Honorable The Proprietaries. In Pursuance of a special order and in part of a Warrant for ten thousand acres dated 27th Sept<sup>r</sup> 1773 by Chas Stewart Dy Sur<sup>t</sup>.
