

Whereas Richard Hill, Isaac Norris & James Logan Commissioners of Property by their warrant dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of October Anno 1720 granted at the request of Thomas Griffiths of Philadelphia did authorize and require me to resurvey a certain tract of land in the County of Philadelphia first laid out to Charles Marshal for one thousand acres and in case of any Deficiency to make good the quantity. This may certify that to compleat the whole quantity of one thousand acres with allowance a supplement of one hundred fifty seven acres is required and that there was surveyed in part thereof on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of June 1727 a piece of land in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a corner of a tract of land lately belonging to Anthony Morris where stands a cedar post marked A. M. Thence north west by the same two hundred perches to a corner Then south west <sup>26</sup> tw(o) b. l. perches to the land of Christopher Timmerman. Then by the same and the land of Hans Jurgern Scharp south east 200 perches to a corner of Isaac Norris land Then by the same north east 26 per. to the place of Beginning Containing thirty two acres.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this

ninth day of January 1912.
