

Resurveyd unto Samuel Carpenter a Tract of land Situate partly in Shackamaxon and partly in the Liberties of Philadelphia One hundred and four acres whereof were granted to said Samuel Carpenter by Patent from the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property dated the 29<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1691. And twenty five acres bought of John Bowyer by <sup>deed</sup> dated 2<sup>d</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> 1700 and eighty acres granted by Patent Dated the 29<sup>th</sup> 3<sup>mo</sup> 1691 being the said Samuel Carpenters proportion of Lib<sup>ty</sup> land and eighty acres of Lib: land granted by the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> Patent dated the 23<sup>d</sup> of the 11<sup>mo</sup>, 1687<sup>8</sup> to Rob<sup>t</sup> Turner in right of James Harrison. The land R. Turner by Deed Dated the 14<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1695 conveyd said 80 acres to Israel Taylor, Joseph Taylor and Mary the wife of John Buzby, Israel Taylor and Jos: Taylor by Deed Dated the 10<sup>th</sup> of the fourth month 1698. Conveyd their right in the 5<sup>d</sup> eighty acres to the said J<sup>r</sup> Buzby and Mary his wife who by their Deed Dat 10<sup>th</sup> 4<sup>mo</sup> 98. Conveyd the said eighty acres to said Sa<sup>ml</sup> Carpenter: and one hundred <sup>of six acres</sup> acres conveyd to the ~~said~~ said Sam<sup>l</sup> Carpenter from Tho. Fairman by Dated the 27<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1706 all which said parcels of land lying contiguous are taken into one Tract Beginning at a Post by Gunners Creek at a corner of Thomas Fairmans land Thence north west through the Marsh or swamp to a post by the Edge of the fast land. Then continuing the same course 53 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> perches to a post. Then south west 30 (001) to a post Then north west 32 perches to a post Thence no: east 30 perches to a post Thence north west 130 per. to a post Thence north 70 degr<sup>s</sup> west 157 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>ches. All the courses hitherto mentioned Running by the Land of <sup>ye said</sup> Tho: Fairman Thence by the land of John Goodson north north west 80 perches to a post. Thence by the land of Arnold Castle east north east 94 perches to a black oak. Again by the said Arnold Castles land, north north west 113 <sup>cast 70: east</sup> perches to a post at a corner of Edward Jones land Then by the said land, 113 perches to a post Then south south east two hundred and forty four perches to a post Then west south west fifteen perches to a post. Then south forty one degrees east one hundred and ninety perches to a post Then north 62 degrees east Crossing a small creek four perches <sup>of a</sup> half to a post. Then down the said small creek on the courses thereof to the Great Creek. Then down the same on the courses east to the Beginning. Containing three hundred and eighty ~~two~~ acres.
