At the request of Katherine Relict of Swan Swanson, Ann Relict of Andrew Swanson and Lydia Relict of Ole Swanson that I would grant them to take up each of them one Lot within the City of Philadelph^a, in consideration that their said Husbands were ancient Inhabitants and Improvers near y^e place where y^e sd City now stands. These are to require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the sd Katherine Ann & Lydia & to each of them one Lot in some convenient street ^{or Streets} of the sd City equally as near as may be in Goodness and value, and make returns of the sd surveys into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and seal at Philadelphia the 6th day of the 8th moth 1701.
