

Whereas Richard Hill Isaac Norris and James Logan, Commissioners of Property by their warrant dated the 14th day of October Anno 1720 Granted at the request of Thomas Griffiths of Philadelphia did authorize and require me to resurvey a certain Tract of land in the County of Philadelphia first laid out to Charles Marshal for one thousand acres and ⁱⁿ case of any deficiency to make good the quantity. This may certify that to compleat the whole quantity of one thousand acres with allowance Requires a supplement of one hundred fifty seven acres and that there was surveyd in part thereof on the seventh day of June 1727 a piece of land in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a corner of a tract of land lately belonging to Anthony Morris where stands a cedar post marked A. M. thence north west by the same 200 perches to a corner. Then south west 26 perches to the land of Christopher Timmerman. Then by the same and the land of Hans Jurgen Scharp ^{SE} 200 perches to a corner of Isaac Norris land Then by the same north east 26 perches to the place of beginning Containing thirty two acres Surveyd also on the said 7th day of June 1727 the remainder of the said supplement in the Township of Limrick in the said County of Philadelphia beginning at a black oak at a corner of William Woodley's land Thence by the same north east 125 perches to a post Then by vacant land north west 160 perches. Then south west by the land of Richard Hains 125 perches to a post Then by the land of George Boon south east 160 perches to the place of beginning. Containing One hundred twenty five acres.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this
