By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Thomas Shute that we would grant him to take up and improve the north part of a square of Ground which lies between the sixth & seventh Streets from Delaware and between Mulberry & Sassafrass Streets of the City Philad<sup>a</sup> and that he may hold y<sup>e</sup> same from y<sup>e</sup> Term of one and Twenty years next ensuing after y<sup>e</sup> date hereof for w<sup>ch</sup> he agrees to pay to y<sup>e</sup> use of the Prop<sup>y</sup> or Trustees of y<sup>e</sup> Province Twenty shillings Sterling Money of Great Britain yearly during y<sup>e</sup> said Term and at y<sup>e</sup> expiration thereof to deliver up & surrender the same under a good fence and well improved.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto y<sup>e</sup> said Thomas Shute in the place aforesaid the said north part of a square of Ground To be by him held under y<sup>e</sup> said yearly Rent of Twenty shillings which in case y<sup>e</sup> said Thomas Shute yearly fulfill and pay then this survey shall be for y<sup>e</sup> said Term valid otherwise y<sup>e</sup> same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted.
