



Pennsylvania S.S.

In pursuance of a Warrant Dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November 1741 requiring me to Survey for the Use and  
Behoof of the Honourable the Proprietaries the tenth part of all such Lands as shall be Surveyed within the said Province  
I caused to be Surveyed on the 15<sup>th</sup> Day of September 1742 a Tract of Land Situate on the Branches of \_\_\_\_\_ at the foot of  
the North Mountain on the West side of Susquehanna River in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a marked White  
Oak near the said Mountain and from thence Extending by Vacant Land South East four hundred and forty perches  
to a marked Pine, and North East One hundred and Twenty seven Perches to a marked White oak - thence by  
Alexander McGlures Land North West Eighty perches to a marked White oak, and North East Ninety five perches  
to a marked Spanish Oak, thence by John McGlures Land North West One Hundred and Eighty Perches to a marked  
Spanish Oak, and North East Two hundred and Seventy eight perches to a marked Hickory, thence by Vacant Land  
North West One hundred and Eighty perches to a marked Spanish Oak, thence along the foot of the said Mountain  
South West Five hundred Perches to the Place of Beginning Containing Eight Hundred and twenty three Acres and  
a Quarter of an Acre, and the usual allowance of six Acres p Cent for Roads &c<sup>o</sup> Returned into the Secretarys Office the

Day of Anno Domini 1746.
