A Draught of sundry Tracts of Land in Plumsted Town<sup>sh</sup> in the County of Bucks, Shewing after what manner upon a View & Review of several persons appointed by the Court of the s<sup>d</sup> County upon divers debates between Matthew Hughes Esq<sup>r</sup> & Enoch Pearson a Road is laid out & after deliberate Consideration confirmed by the said Court to a landing on the Land of Enoch Pearson afores<sup>d</sup> which is judged most convenient for a ferry and most agreeable to a Ferry already established in West-Jersey, and John Reading having taken much pains to view the ground on both sides the River hath lately communicated his thoughts thereon to James Steel by a Letter which clearly sets forth his Judgement in the Case The said Road is here laid down from a Copy of the Record under the hand of
