



Draught of a Tract of land situate part in Hamilton & part in St. Thomas Townships Franklin County (formerly Antrim Township Lancaster County) Containing 89 acres 142 perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Surveyed 30th October, 1828 on a warrant to Matthew Arthur for 100 acres "on the East Side of Bach Creek in Antrim township dated the 15th October 1744. And in pursuance of a Contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under Proprietary Rights &c.

Notes Contractors

On a Resurvey of the above lines found little or no variation from a former survey, except at the place boundary marked A where the boundary on the ground varies from the official survey's returned on both sides which boundary appears not altogether settled by the parties in interest Note it may be somewhat doubtful whether the above Warrant was intended to be located on the above spot, as it merely locates land on South side of Bach Creek. No Survey or any particular evidence of the above being the land intended Other than Mathew Arthur owned land on North side of Bach Creek, and James Arthur the Son (appears to have inherited after the said Arthur) had the above land surveyed in 1767, as will be seen by his survey mentioned in Report. Report. The above black lined ~~survey~~ <sup>figure</sup> embracing E. & D. represents the lines of a survey made for Patrick Jacht the 22d day of June 1793 on his warrant dated the 15 December, 1792 and confirmed by Patent; which tract or Survey covers the whole of the survey herewith returned on the Warrant to Matthew Arthur as described on the opposite page. The red lined figure embracing A. B. C. & F. represents the lines of a survey made for said Patrick Jacht about the year 1793 on a Warrant to James Ward bearing date 28 October 1746, containing 118 acres 128 perches & returned. The dotted lined figure embracing A. & E. represent the lines of a survey of 172 1/2 as purporting to be made in the year 1767 for James Arthur in pursuance of a warrant dated 28 October 1746 and returned to land Office, but upon diligent search being made no such warrant is found granted to the said James Arthur. Therefore it is presumable that the warrant mentioned in Arthurs Survey, was that of James Ward which was subsequently laid upon a part of the same land under the ~~direction~~ direction of Patrick Jacht as above set forth. The Warrant of Ward bearing the same date as that of James Arthur, to wit, the 28 Oct: 1746. Note. The above tract marked E. D. is owned by the heirs of George Schneider under the title founded on Patrick Jachts Warrant of 15 Dec'r, 1792. Occupied by Daniel Schneider one of the heirs. Wm. S. Davis
