Surveyed on the 11th of October, 1828, the above described tract of land containing three hundred and forty nine acres and forty perches and the allowance proportioned at six per cent for Roads &c. Situate on Sewichley Creek in Hempfield township, Westmoreland County, Penn.

Report for James Greer, Viz:

The tract No. 1 on the Diagram was surveyed and returned for John Perry on a warrant dated Feb^y 5th 19th 1795 and is now the property of John Byers. No. 2 was surveyed unto Lewis Zerlin at one time, but it has had several owners since that it might have been returned in some other name, the owner lives off from the land a considerable distance that I could see the Patent but was informed positively that I was patented No. 3 was surveyed on a Warrant granted to John Welsh ^{or Wiles} dated November 7th 1786 and is now his property.

I was informed this was the land he ~~had~~ had applied for, his description itself calls for this ground but he never had possession of any part of it to the knowledge of any individual in that section of the County. Gabriel Hiester Es. Surveyor General of Pa. S. L. C.
