



A Draft of A Tract of Land situate on Dorans Run in Greenfield township Bedford County Containing seven hundred and forty nine acres and one hundred and twenty perches and allowance of six percent for roads & so. Surveyed for James Johnston on Warrant dated the 1st day of June, 1763. No. 2 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of A Tract of land surveyed for William Kennedy on Order No. 1367 dated the 26th day of September 1766. This tract interferes one acre and one hundred and fifteen perches with the James Johnston survey. William Kennedy conveyed to James Hunter who devised the same to James Hunter the present owner. No. 1 represented by late colored lines is a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Edward Evers on Order No. 29 dated the 1st day of August 1766. This tract interferes four hundred and fifty three and one fourth acres with the James Johnston survey. Edward Evers conveyed to Dr. William Smith (who owned one moiety of the James Johnston tract by virtue of a conveyance from said Johnston). Dr. William Smith devised it to Charles Goldsbor- rough the present owner. No. 3 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for David Pressal on Warrant dated the 16th day of July 1821. This tract interferes thirty five acres and twelve perches with the James Johnston survey. David Pressal is the present owner. No. 4 represented by dotted lines is a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Joseph Cook on Warrant dated the 15th day of February, 1775. This tract interferes fifty four acres and one hundred & sixty two perches with the James Johnston Survey. Joseph Cook conveyed to Adam Shaver the present owner. No. 5 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Col. Henry Boquet on Warrant dated the 7th day of July 1762. This tract interferes one hundred and thirty two perches with the James Johnston survey. Col. Henry Boquet devised the same to Sir Frederick Haldamand who devised the same to Anthony Francis Holdimond the present owner, General Cadwallader of Philadelphia his agent
