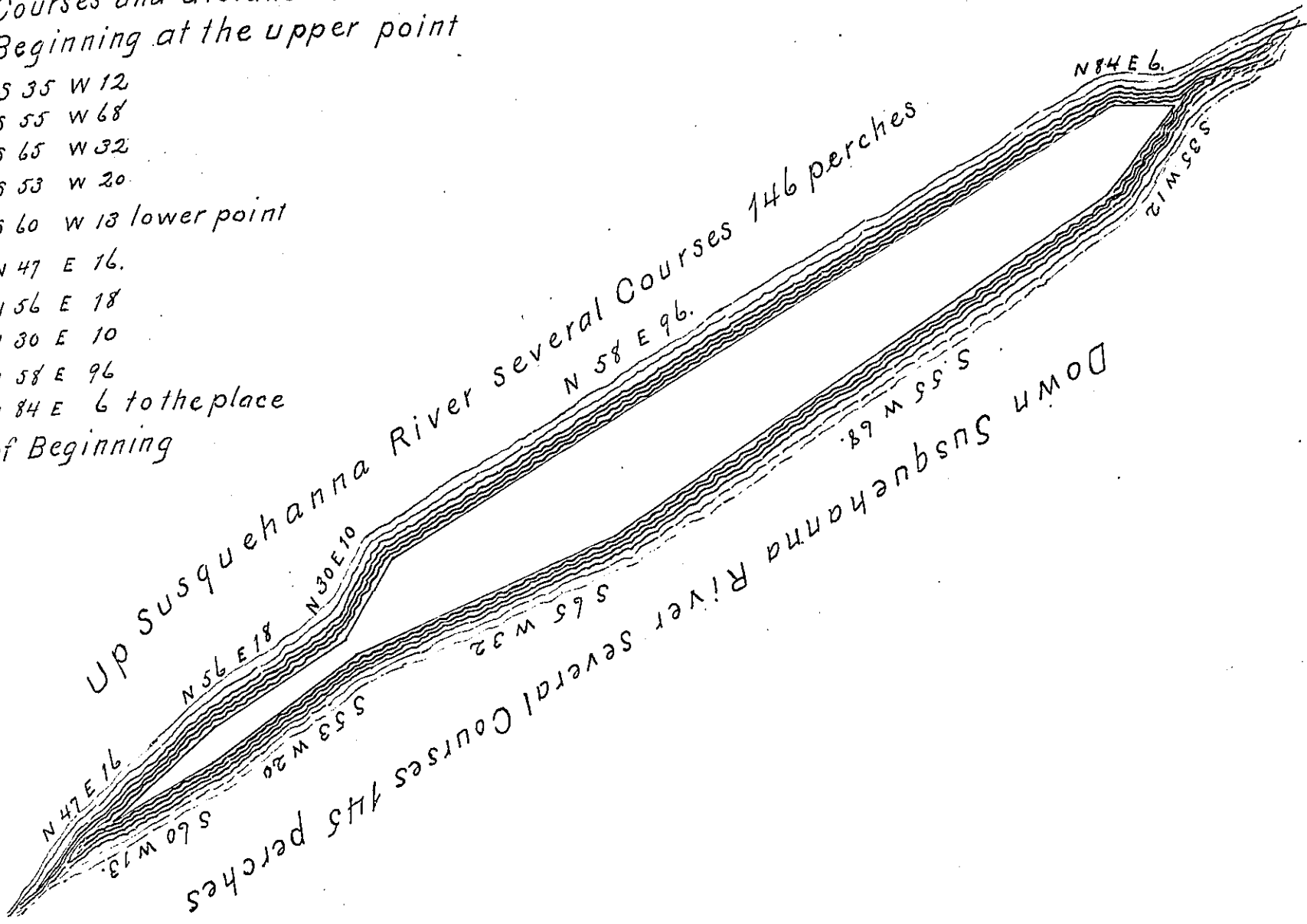

and 130 perches, and Allowance, of six Per Cent
for Roads &c.
