Surveyed, on the 12th of Sept. 1816 for William Allison, Theophilus Carter, and Samer Woolmer, the above described Island, situate in the River Susquehanna, in Derry Township Dauphin County, called "Birch Island, about three quarters of a mile below the Swatara riffles, about the same distance from the Dauphin County shore, opposite, on the East to land, of the heirs of David Deitweiler, de. cd. and, on the West to land, of the heirs of Abraham Shelley, decd. about three rods distant from the Eastern side, of the lower gap Island, and, about three Hundred yards west from the Upper end, of the long Island, containing eighty five perches, strict measure by warrant, of the 4th September 1816.
