



Situate in Norwegian township Schuylkill County containing two hundred and twelve acres and one hundred and forty nine perches and the allowance of six per Cent. partially surveyed on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of June 1823 in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 23<sup>d</sup> day of May 1815 granted John Adams. It appears from a draft on record in this office that a survey was made under the directions of James McFarland Esquire a former deputy Surveyor on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of June 1815 which was in part incorrectly done

The improvements are two Saw mills a dwelling house, barn, garden, fruit trees and (obscured) red lands first (said to have been commenced) about the year 179 (c. 1.) J. Lauderbrun
