

The Above Draught Describes 2 small Pieces of Land which were Survey'd the 19th of the 4th month (April) 1753. Unto William Graham (or Grymes) In Pursuance of a Warrant Granted unto him bearing Date the 21st Day of the Month called August 1752. Containing in both 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres & the Allowance at the Rate of 6^a per Cent. That is, in the largest Piece. 11 acres & nine perches, & in the other two acres one Quarter & thirty two perches; which both lay adjoining a Tract of Land in Possession of his Mother under Maryland Patent & he desires to have both Pieces included in one Patent if it (obl.) to take a Strip of 2 perches wide out of the Maryland P(obl.)nt to join (obl.) together in form of the Prick'd lines above. Situate near Susquehanah River adjoining the Temporary Line in Little Britain Township Lancaster County. Laid down by a Scale of 30 perches to an Inch & Certify'd.
