



By virtue of a Warrant dated the 26th February 1810 Surveyed the 9th May 1817 to Christopher Gower the above described tract of Land Situate in Chestnut Hill township Northampton County containing three hundred and forty three Acres twenty perches and the allowance of six P. Gent.

N.B. The house in which Gower lives stands on his other land purchased from Owen Rice and adjoins the line of this tract. There is a stable and garden on the land and about three Acres cleared on which grain has been repeatedly raised. The house has been once burnt and the present dwelling house Erected in the same place.
