



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the 21th day of April A.D. 1794. granted to John Gray was surveyed on the Second day of December A.D. 1817. The above described tract of land containing 401 acres 18 perches and allowance of six per cent. for roads, &c. situated in Cassewago township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, Miles Tinney was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of twenty acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, ~~and that the same was divided as above stated~~
