



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries Bearing Date the 27<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1739 Surveyed to James Hutchenson A Tract of Land in the Township of Donegal Beginning at a Birch tree (on) side of Sickasalinga Creek thence South 11 Deg. West 103 perches to Black Oak thence South East by South 30 perches to a Hickory thence East by South 30 perches to a Hickory thence North by West 177 perches to a Black Oak thence East 10 1/4 North 115 perches to a Black Oak thence North 82 Deg. West 177 perches to a Hickory thence North 13 Deg. West 24 perches to a Hickory thence West 40 perches to a post thence North 29 Deg. West 28 perches to a Spruce Growing By the side of Sickasalinga Creek thence Down the Several Courses of the Creek 102 perches to the place of Beginning Containing One Hundred & fifty nine Acres of Land with the usual Allowance of Six Acres P Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed March the 21<sup>st</sup> Anno Dom 1738 8/9
