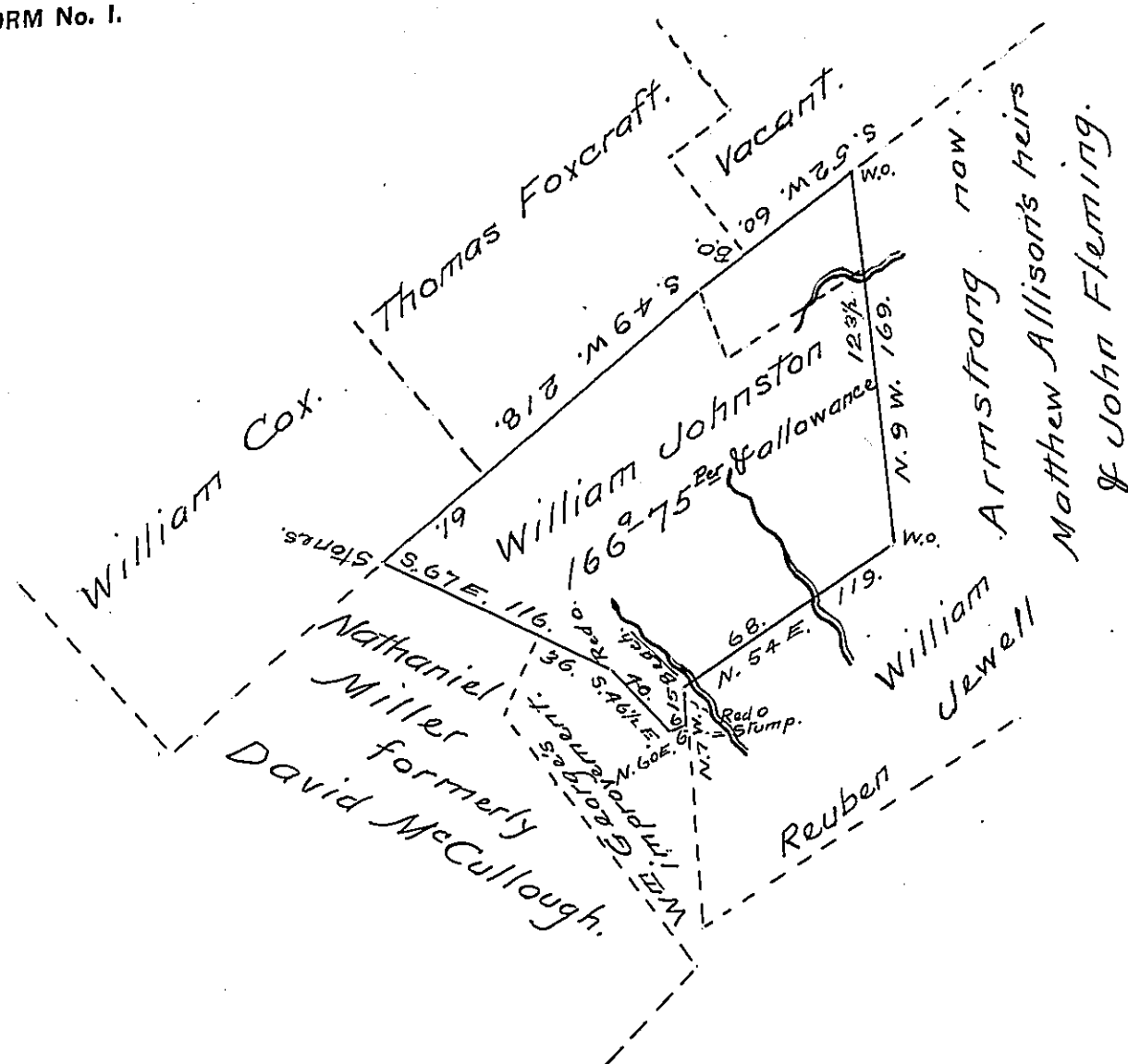

Surveyed to William Johnston on the 13th of January A.D. 1836 the above described tract of one hundred & sixty six acres & seventy five perches & allowance of land adjoining & bounded as above described in Armstrong township Indiana County By warrant of 30th November A.D. 1835.

N.B. the above includes an improvement - the trapezium like figure dotted off in the North east corner of the above & which contains fifteen acres & one hundred & five perches & allowance (David Anthony had sometime since surveyed in with a piece of land for which I understand he is applying for a warrant - Johnston in the mean time has been paying taxes for one hundred & eighty seven acres) it is unimproved with the exception of a few rods in a field which John Fleming cleared by permission of John McCullough from ^{whom} Johnston made the purchase.
