



Surveyed on the (obl) day of March 1733 to Anthony L (obl) a certain Tract of land situate in Oley in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a White Oak a Corner of Hans Yoders land thence by ye same South East one hundred and twenty one perches to a Swamp Oak thence by vacant land North East one hundred & sixty perches to a Chesnut tree thence North West by Vacant land one hundred & one perches to a hickery in the line of John Keims land thence by the same South west one hundred & twenty perches to a white Oak a Corner of said Keims land thence by the same North West twenty perches to a white Oak being a Corner of sd Anthony Lees other land thence by ye (obl) th West forty perches to ye place of beginning Containing one hundred acres with usual allowance
