



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the first Day of October Anno Dom 1737 the above mentioned Tract of Land was Surveyed unto Evan Lloyd in the Township of Cumru in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Stone Thence North 43 Degrees West by Vacant Land 120 perches to a Stone Thence North 30 Degrees East by the same 20 perches to a Stone Thence North 14 Degrees West 27 perches to a Stone in the Line of John Jones Thence North 60 Degrees East by the same 135 perches to a Hickory Thence South 30 Degrees East by the Land of David Lewis 18 perches to a Stone Thence North 47 Deg<sup>s</sup> East by the same 95 perches to a Stone Thence South South East by other Land of ye<sup>sd</sup> Evan Lloyd 81 perches to a Black Oak Thence West Sou. West by the Land of Henry Harry 5 perches to a post Thence South South East 29 perches to a Stone Thence South 47 Degrees West by the Land of Thomas James and Vacant Land 211 perches to the place of Beginning Containing One Hundred and Seventy acres Beside ye<sup>al-</sup>lowance of six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent.
