



By virtue of a warrent dated the 13th December 1750 surveyed 15th June 1766 to James McCarty the above discribed tract of land containing one hundred and forty eight acres & the allowance of 6 P^{er} cent which said tract is now divided between James McCarty and William McCarty the latter having ninety as and 112 perches and the allowance of 6 p^{er} cent as his part of the original situate in upper smithfield Township formely Northampton, ^{County} now Pike the dotted lines represent the Residue of the original as James McCarty's part
