



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the Twenty Eighth day of May 1734 Requiring the Surveyor General to Layout to Henry Stover Two hundred & Twenty five acres of Land in the County of Philada. There was Surveyed unto the said Henry Stover on the Twenty Eighth day of June 1734 a Tract of Land part of the above Two hundred and Twenty five acres Situate on a Branch of Perkiomi in the County of Philada. Beginning at a hickery a corner of Lewis's Land thence by land of Daniel Stover South East Sixty Eight perches to a White Oak another corner of S<sup>d</sup>. Daniel's land thence by land of John Cartmel South West Eighty Eight perches to a Stone thence by Vacant Land North West Sixty Eight perches to a post thence by the said Richard Lewis's land North East Eighty Eight perches to ye place of Beginning Cont. Thirty five acres with ye usual allowance of six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent. Surveyed June 28<sup>th</sup> 1734
