



In PURSUANCE of a Warrant from the Proprietaries — dated the 27th. day of January 1734 Survey'd unto Thomas Smedley on the tenth day of February then next Ensuing a piece or parcel of Land Situate in Willis Town in the County of Chester Beginning at a post being a Corner of Lawrence Cocks's Land thence S. 66^d west by the land of William Hudson 56 ps. to a post thence S. 24^d East by the Land of the s^d Thomas Smedley 148 Pches to a post thence N. 66^d East by the Land of Francis Yarnall four Pches to a post thence South 48^d Easterly by the same Land two Pches & a Quarter to a White Oak, thence N. 42^d Easterly by the Indians Land 56 Pches to a post thence N. 24^d westerly by the Land of the s^d. Lawrence Cocks 127 Pches to the place of Beginning Containing Forty Six acres and the usual allowance for Roads. ~
